# $\sim$ Putting out tree cuttings and dead leaves $\sim$

OPruned branches, Dead leaves ..... · Combustible waste

A limit of two 45L plastic bags of this type of waste may be put out at any one time. Tie up the bags securely with string or similar before putting them out.

If you have more than this amount to put out, it will be treated as special waste (a

charge will be incurred).

\* Branches can be up to 5cm thick and 1m long. Any items larger than this cannot be processed by the City, so you will need to ask a specialist business instead.


If handled as incombustible waste, the tape inside the cassette can become tangled in the crusher which can result in problems, so video cassette tapes should be treated as combustible waste.

# **Sorting support** (small household appliances and small rechargeable batteries)

### ~ Collection box of small household appliances and small rechargeable batteries ~

When discarding small household appliances, put them in the blue exclusive collection box installed in public facilities in the city, and put small rechargeable batteries in the yellow exclusive collection box.

[What can be put in a box]

Small home appliances ••• Small home appliances within 31cm wide x 15cm long

Mobile phones, smart phones, telephones, fax machines, radios, laptop computers, digital cameras, music players, hair dryers, electric shaving, game machines, calculators, etc.

Small rechargeable battery

Nicad batteries, nickel hydride batteries, lithium-ion batteries (mobile batteries and heated electric cigarettes are also included)

\*\*Out of the above, other than mobile phones, smartphones, and laptop computers, you can put them out in incombustible garbage. (Please contact your dealer or manufacturer for mobile phones, smartphones, laptops.) \*Desktop PCs can not be collected in the city. Please contact your dealer or manufacturer.

Main building of city hall, Health and Welfare Center, Each city station (Excluding the West), Industry Promotion Center, Civic hall, City Gymnasium, Child-raising refreshment house, Each community center (including Minami Community Center annex), Esupoaru, Public health center, AEON MALL Shijonawate(Small household appliances only).





# $\sim$ What is incombustible waste? $\sim$

Waste which contains materials such as metal which will not burn is termed 'incombustible waste'. Furthermore, items which partially consist of materials which can be burned are also incombustible waste, but waste which needs to be crushed into small pieces is still 'incombustible waste'.



- Drving racks, Fans, CDs/DVDs, Cork boards, Plastic toys, etc.
- Electric carpet. Electric blankets
- ★Rugs, Carpets ...... Combustible waste




### ~ CDs and DVDs?~

○CDs, DVDs (including cases) ··· ··· Incombustible waste

#### (Explanation)

CDs and DVDs are made from plastic, but put them out together with their covers on the same days as incombustible waste.





# $\sim$ Plant pots and planter boxes? $\sim$

- OPlant pots------ Incombustible waste
- OPlanter boxes ...... Incombustible waste
- OSeedling pots ...... Plastic waste/PET Bottles
- \* Items which cannot be cleaned should be put out on the same days as combustible waste.
- OSoil ······ Items difficult to process





#### (Explanation)

Planter boxes should be put out on the same day as incombustible waste, regardless of what material they are made from. Soil cannot be collected by Neyagawa City, so please arrange for a specialist business or store to collect it.

#### $\chi$ Spray cans can be dropped off at your nearest special site. **Batteries and Lighters should be packaged separately!**

If batteries, any lighters, spray cans are mixed in the other garbage bags, it may cause a fire accident of the packer truck. It is up to individuals to take the necessary care to prevent accidents from happening, we hope that you will understand this and give your full cooperation to preventing such accidents.

#### <How to put out garbage>

- OLighters. Batteries .....Incombustible waste (Please put the batterys and lighters in separate transparent bags.)
- OSpray cans ..... Collection at the special site
- \* Please check our website or ask at the Clean Center for the location of your nearest special site.







# **Separation support (Waste plastic and PET bottle section)**

# $\sim$ What are plastic containers and packaging (waste plastic) and PET bottles? $\sim$

OPlastic containers and packaging (waste plastic) are plastics and PET bottles which include the symbols shown at right as specified in the Container and Packaging Recycling Law.





# $\sim$ Putting out PET bottles $\sim$ Remove the cap. Remove the label. Rinse in water.

# Putting out plastic containers and packaging (waste plastic)

If any food or drink leftovers remain in the plastic containers and packaging. **lightly rinse** them in left over water from dishwashing before putting them out.

\* If rinsing does not make the items clean, put them out on the same day as combustible waste.

# $\sim$ Are some items not "waste plastic" even though they are made of plastic? $\sim$

Waste plastic refers to "plastic containers and packaging".

Some items cannot be recycled, even though they are made from plastic. Some examples of such items which we often get asked about are listed here.

- OWash basins ...... Incombustible waste
- Ocoat hangers ......Incombustible waste
- OSoap containers ......Incombustible waste
- OTupperware ......Incombustible waste OBuckets.....Incombustible waste
- Oclothes cases ......Incombustible waste
- \* Waste garbage exceeding 40 cm x 100 cm x 40 cm is regarded as large-sized waste.
- OToothbrushes ......Combustible waste
- OPlastic spoons ......Combustible waste



Items which can be put out on "Cans/Bottles" days include cans and bottles for foodstuffs and beverages. Other cans and bottles should be put out on "Incombustible waste" days.

# ☆Notification of intention to put out recyclable waste

When you are putting out recyclable waste such as aluminum cans and old paper, it can be useful to attach a label saying "Recyclable waste for city collection" to help prevent the waste being carried off without authorization.

Garbage trucks carry such notification labels with them, so if you attract the attention of the driver, you can obtain these labels for your use.

# ~ What is special waste? ~

- OWaste garbage exceeding 40 cm x 100 cm x 40 cm is regarded as large-sized waste. (Drawers, Beds, Cupboards, etc.)
- Olf you have a lot of special waste to put out at once, such as when moving house. Such waste is treated as "special waste" and will incur a fee or removal.

Refrigerators, Freezers, Air conditioners, TVs, Washing machines, Clothes dryers

The above six types of item are treated as "special waste".

- \* Please purchase recycling coupons at the post office beforehand.
- \* Separate shipping and collection charges will be required.

# $\sim$ This is also "special waste" $\sim$

Some types of waste may be treated as special waste even if they are not so large in size. Some examples of such items which we often get asked about are listed here.

OBicycles (Including parts)

Note that bicycles are always treated as special waste, regardless of whether they are for children or adults or are of some other size.

OPortable gas range, Gas stoves

Items with igniters cannot be collected as incombustible waste. They are treated as special waste.

\* Stoves which do not include igniters should be put out as incombustible waste.

OKerosene stoves

Items with igniters can become crushed and ignite when they are compressed, and this can lead to fires, so such items are treated as special waste.

\* Electric stoves, charcoal heaters and halogen heaters are incombustible waste.
